

We're now well into Lent and so perhaps it's time to ask, "How's it going?"

It's true that you won't find the word 'Lent' in the Bible, but at the heart of Lent is a desire to be right with God, and so making use of this season to bring our lives back into the way of the Lord is surely a good thing.

In our reading from Luke's Gospel today we're going to hear Jesus make the same plea twice. In both Luke 13:3 & 13:5 he says, *"unless you repent, you too will all perish."*

It might be that this Lent is passing you by, or perhaps the focus of Lent has become giving up something like TV soaps or chocolate - but as we listen to the voice of Jesus we can't help but see that there's something very profound at stake; our very souls. Fasting, reflection, Bible study and prayer in themselves can't save us, but Lent provides us with an invitation to a season of these things so that we can see Jesus and his way more clearly.

So how is your lent going? Let's pray that we all see Jesus more clearly, love him more dearly, and follow him more nearly as time goes by.

Collect for 23rd March

Eternal God, give us insight to discern your will for us, to give up what harms us, and to seek the perfection we are promised in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
